### **CURRICULUM FEEDBACK** ACADEMIC YEAR (2019-20)

In this academic year, the college successfully delivered the curriculum adapting smoothly to the challenges of the online mode, in the backdrop of the on-going pandemic. The teachers as well as students, through the well-timed and in-depth training and resources provided by the management, completed the syllabus by effectively utilizing the online modes and methods.

In continuation of the on-going feedback method as suggested by the IQAC (to obtain feedback from students in a graded manner, i.e., taking feedback, first, from First Year students and then gradually moving to the subsequent batches in the following years), in this academic year, feedback from First year, Second Year, and Third Year students was obtained. Feedback was also obtained from Law firms and Alumni.

Also, in this year, in order to benefit from the feedback from the outgoing batch, Fifth Year, feedback from Semester IX and X students was also obtained. This suggestion was based on the deliberations made by the IQAC members that as final year students have comprehensive and all-encompassing understanding of the curriculum, especially through their internship and work experience, their feedback would add many practical dimensions to the curriculum in tune with the demands of the industry.

Some of the highlights of the feedback for the A.Y 2019-20 are:

Students: The general feedback received from First Year, Second Year and Third Year students has remained similar in its responses with the suggestion of including contemporary developments into the syllabus. The subject-wise feedback received from Semester IX and X reflect positively on the overall structure, content, and material used for most of the subjects. In certain subjects, the suggestion for the inclusion of more contemporary developments is made.

**Teachers:** While this year too most teachers have given positive feedback on other curricular aspects such as the balance between theory and practice, and the alignment of course objectives and instructional activities carried out in class, as well the freedom to adopt new techniques, it can be deduced that most teachers would suggest that the syllabus can be enriched through the inclusion of more, upcoming topics.

Law Firms /Professionals: In this year the law firm who gave the feedback were of the opinion that curriculum needs better structuring and also the responses indicated the need of balance between theory and practice in the curriculum

**Alumni:** Marginal percentage of the total alumni who gave feedback in this academic year indicated the need for better structuring of curriculum and need for contemporary developments. They all have positive response to the teaching learning process. With respect to Curriculum design, planning and imparting has helped in practical application and in higher studies the responses received were quite divided almost equal number agreed and disagreed with marginal number stating neutral.

The feedback was taken at the end of the academic year, both from teachers and students.
