With the completion of this academic year, the initiative taken by the college in gaining formal feedback from students and teachers to offer more informed and constructive curriculum delivery, has added useful inputs for achieving the desired goal of curriculum enrichment and enhancement in academic planning and implementation. Over the years, there has been inclusion of innovative methodologies to enable students' engagement in an online classroom, and various workshops, seminars, subject-symposium and so on have also been organized to address the need for the inclusion of contemporary developments in legal education and practice.

In this academic year, along with teachers' feedback, feedback from all students across the batches was collected. In continuation of the graded feedback received over the years, as per the suggestion of the IQAC, this year reached the culmination of the proposed plan, and feedback from all students was obtained.

Some of the highlights of the feedback for the A.Y 2020-2021 are:

**Students:** Curricular aspects such as the structure of the syllabus, the material used and the learning processes continue to be rated relatively higher than the aspect of the content coverage. In other words, there's a suggestion of adding newer and latest topics in the syllabus to make it updated and more contemporary.

**Teachers:** Similar suggestion is also made by most teachers of including the latest areas of legal education and legal practice to make the syllabus more suited for contemporary times.



**Law firm:** The firms from whom the feedback was collected in this academic year were of the opinion that there is need for better structuring of syllabus. Very few indicated need on other aspects like balance of theory and practice

**Alumni:** Alumni who gave feedback in this year indicated a positive response for curriculum structure curriculum planning and teaching learning process. However for Contemporary developments and higher studies related questions they responses indicated a gap.

The feedback was taken at the end of the academic year, both from teachers and students.
