Survey Report on Plastic Waste Management

Introduction

Plastic pollution has become one of the most pressing environmental challenges of the modern era. The excessive use of single-use plastics, improper disposal, and inadequate waste management systems have significantly contributed to environmental degradation. This survey was conducted to assess public awareness, attitudes, and practices related to plastic usage and plastic waste management.

Objectives of the Study

- To understand the frequency and type of plastic usage
- To assess awareness about plastic pollution and its impacts
- To analyze public opinion on government regulations and penalties
- To evaluate willingness to adopt eco-friendly alternatives
- To identify gaps in waste management infrastructure

Methodology

The survey was conducted using Google Forms with a sample size of 50 respondents. The questionnaire included multiple-choice, opinion-based, and rating-scale questions covering plastic consumption, awareness, responsibility, and solutions.

Key Findings

The survey revealed very high awareness of plastic pollution. However, frequent use of single-use plastic continues. There is strong public support for government regulations, bans, and penalties. Respondents believe that individuals, industries, and the government must work together to address plastic pollution.

Conclusion

The findings show a positive attitude toward reducing plastic pollution, supported by strong awareness and approval of regulatory measures. However, gaps between awareness and action remain. Strengthening waste management systems, promoting affordable alternatives, and encouraging community participation are essential for long-term sustainability.

Recommendations

- Enforce stricter plastic bans and littering penalties
- Improve recycling and waste collection infrastructure
- Promote affordable eco-friendly alternatives
- Encourage public participation in cleanup drives
- Increase corporate accountability for plastic packaging

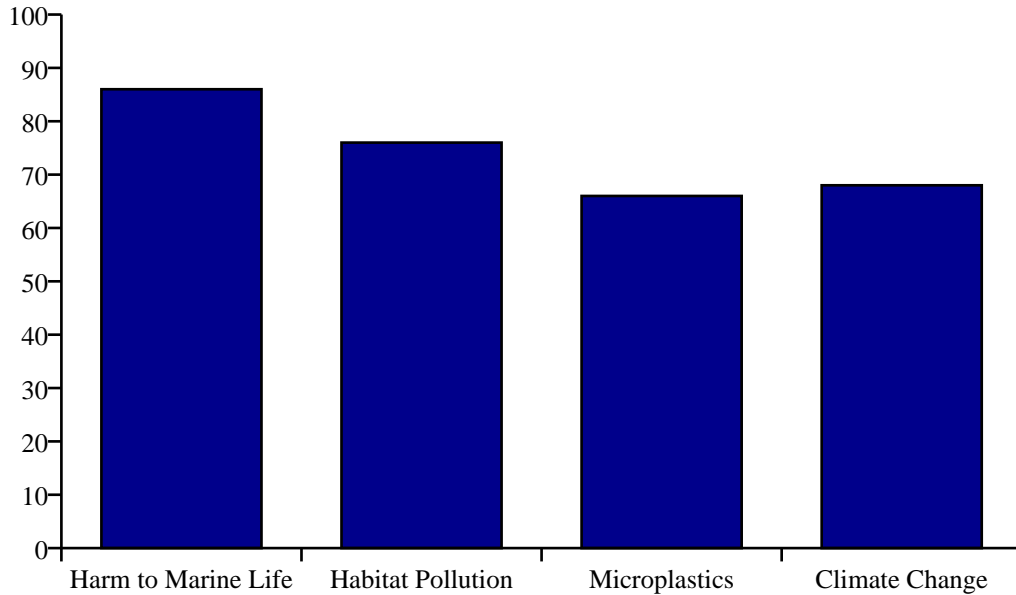


Chart 6: Participation in Cleanup Drives

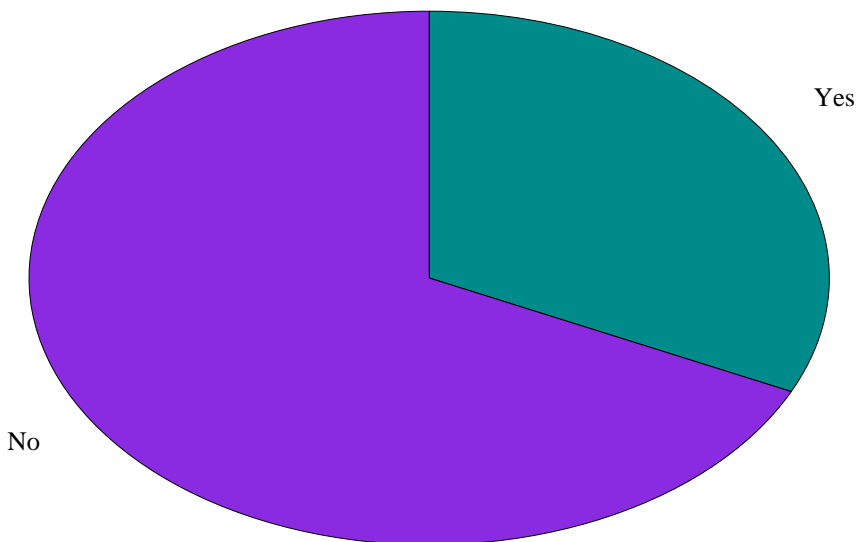


Chart 7: Major Causes of Plastic Pollution

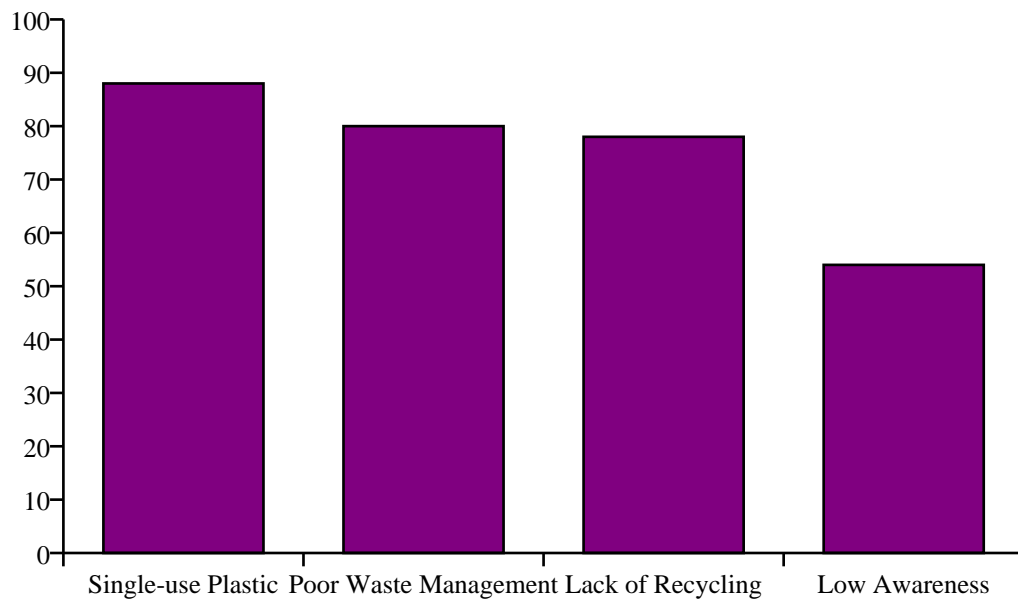


Chart 8: Need for Government Regulations

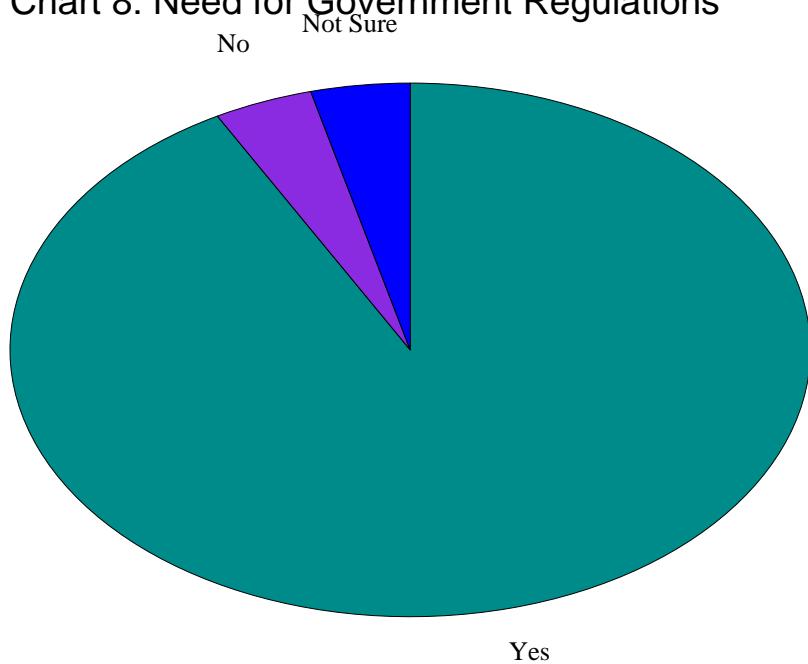


Chart 9: Willingness to Pay for Eco-Friendly Products

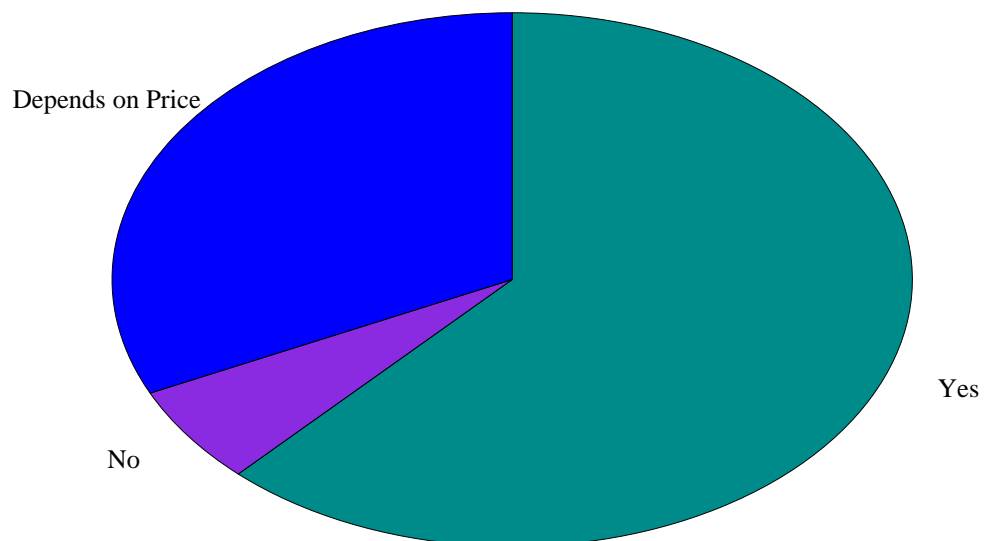


Chart 10: Industries That Should Reduce Plastic Use

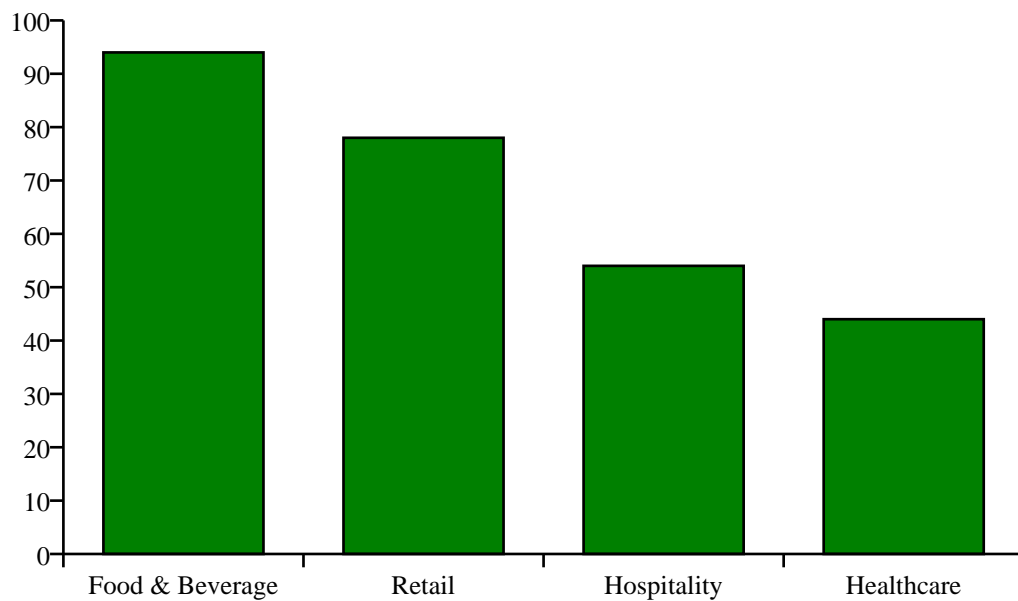


Chart 11: Support for Deposit-Return Systems

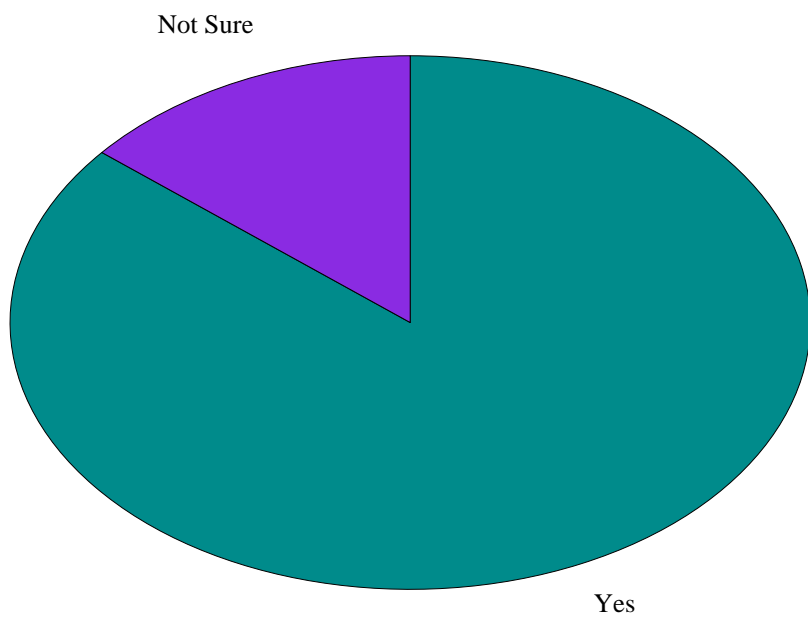


Chart 12: Other Environmental Actions Taken

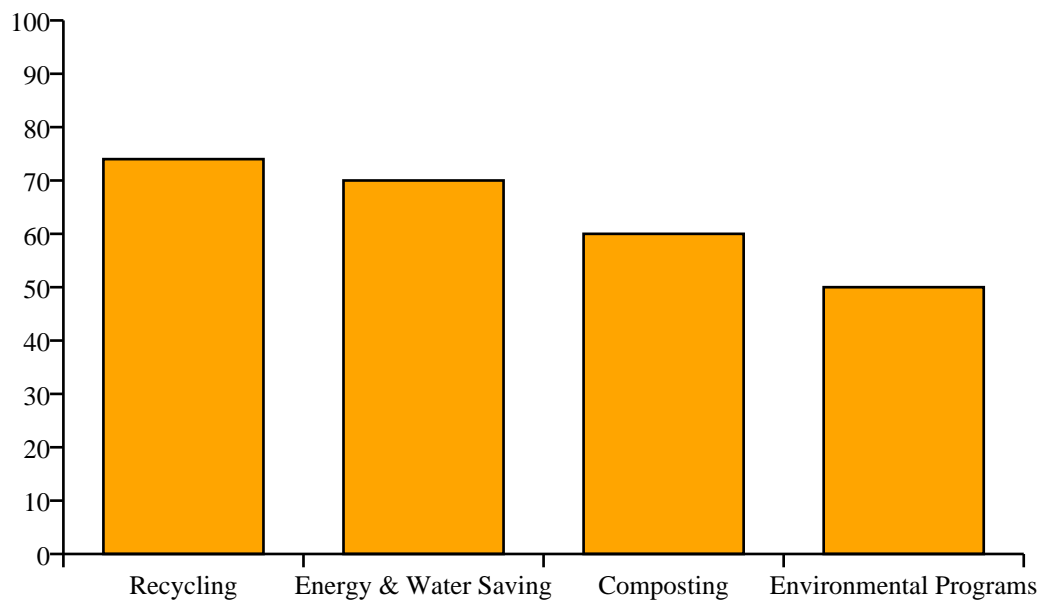


Chart 13: Availability of Local Plastic Waste Collection Facilities

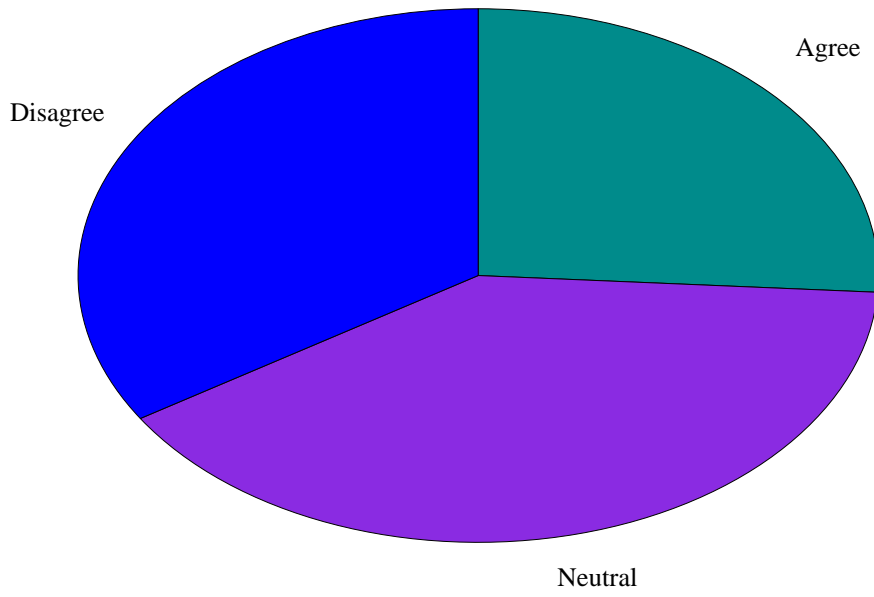


Chart 14: Support for Penalties on Plastic Littering
